Julia Pols






Anushka Shenoy

Sharon is also a blogger for the Chidren's Book Academy.




Dhwani Gosalia






Megha Vishwanath




Lisa Wee




Anastasiia Morozova




Moyra Irving





Nadia is an Australian author of Indian and Irish descent. She is a children's author and award-winning short story writer who believes passionately in the power of stories to make the world a better place.



They are made up of two parts.


